

The Seawater Intrusion Working Group (SWIG) was established by SVBGSA staff as the first step in implementing the Groundwater Sustainability Plan for the 180/400 foot aquifer. The SWIG is designed to pull together the best available science, data, and understanding of local seawater intrusion causes and potential resolutions to develop an agreed-to approach for managing seawater intrusion. SWIG is a 22 member Committee that also includes an approximate 10 member Technical Advisory Group. SWIG advises SVBGSA staff and is not a legislative body subject to the Brown Act open meeting law. However, meetings are publicly posted at svbgsa.org/meetings for the benefit of the community that wishes to attend and remain informed of SWIG's progress.
